George Monbiot



George Monbiot has been described as “One of the 25 most influential people in the UK”.

George Monbiot is the author of the best selling books *The Age of Consent: a manifesto for a new world order* and *Captive State: the corporate takeover of Britain*, as well as the investigative travel books *Poisoned Arrows*, *Amazon Watershed* and *No Man’s Land*. He writes a weekly column for the Guardian newspaper.

He has held visiting fellowships or professorships at the universities of Oxford (environmental policy), Bristol (philosophy), Keele (politics) and East London (environmental science). He is currently visiting professor of planning at Oxford Brookes University. In 1995 Nelson Mandela presented him with a United Nations Global 500 Award for outstanding environmental achievement

In October 2006 George Monbiot will launch *Heat - How to stop the planet from burning*. It now seems certain that we need a 90% cut in our emissions by 2030 to prevent runaway climate change from taking place. In 'HEAT', George Monbiot explains how the cut could be achieved without bringing the civilisation we know to an end.

Lester R. Brown has been described by the Washington Post as "one of the world's most influential thinkers." The Telegraph of Calcutta called him "the guru of the global environmental movement."

In May 2001, he founded Earth Policy Institute, where he now serves as president. The purpose of the Earth Policy Institute is to provide a vision of an environmentally sustainable economy, a roadmap of how to get from here to there — as well as an ongoing assessment of progress.

Lester Brown has published numerous books on the environment. His latest book is *Plan B 2.0: Rescuing a Planet Under Stress and a Civilization in Trouble* (2006) in which he presents the problems and some of the solutions to issues of resource scarcity, peak oil and population growth.
